Falloon House is the on-site campus home for Ōtorohanga College tauira/students who require board during the school week.

Our experienced Hostel staff have a genuine care and concern for the well-being of our Hostel students. Falloon House is their home during the week and we are committed therefore to it being a friendly and inclusive environment in which to live and grow. The staff and students of the Hostel operate as a family unit, sharing responsibility for the well-being and care of each other.

There is an expectation that our Hostel students will do well academically and will enjoy taking part in the sporting and cultural opportunities offered at the College.

The Ōtorohanga College Hostel, Falloon House, was established in 1975. It caters for boys and girls from outlying areas including Benneydale and the coastal areas of Kawhia, Tahaaroa, Kinohaku and Marokopa. All students return home at weekends by Ministry of Education buses.

The buildings are designed in an open square format, catering for up to sixty five boarders from Years 9 to 13. Girls have individual rooms while boys have a combination of individual rooms and dormitories. The facilities include lounges, recreational areas and a fully equipped kitchen and dining room. Students are supported to participate in a range of community activities and have use of College facilities when appropriate.

A government boarding allowance is available through the Ministry of Education for students living more than 3.8 kilometres from the nearest daily bus service. Visit the Ministry of Education website www.minedu.govt.nz for more information.

Falloon House is committed to maintaining a whānau atmosphere in a safe, and supported learning environment. The Hostel is well managed with clear processes available for complaints; quality care is provided in a welcoming and homely setting.
